

short, dead-end street off North Main St. in Florence. The house is located at the edge of the Mill River terrace and has a sweeping view of the Florence meadows which extend north and south on both sides of the river.

The house is two stories in height with high hipped roof and two-nd-a-half story pedimented projections at the southwest and northeast mers of the house. A one-story porch with hipped roof, square posts a perforated brackets, balustrade and lattice base extends from the front projection across the facade and along the northern side.
