

9. Historical significance (include explanation of themes checked above) In 1887 John and Margaret Riley bought part of lot no. 3 of the Round Hill Estate sub-division for \$600. Mr. Riley was a printer with Metcalf and Co., and made this his homestead.							
Crescent St. had been opened in 1886 and curved gently along the middle slopes of Round Hill. The street provided sweeping views of the Connecticut River Valley and surrounding hills, and quickly became one of the most "aristocratic" streets in the city.							
This house features decoratively-cut shingles as a beltcourse, vertical boarding in the front gable, a one-story front porch with turned posts and balustrade, and a bay window on the southern side.
