ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE (describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within community)

The house is two stories tall with steeply pitched, slate ridge roof. The side gables are pedimented, while the one on the southern side, facing Summer St., having a Falladian window. The fornt slope of the roof has a dormer with semi-circular pediment. I frieze encircular the house beneath the projecting gable and pilasters are used at the corners. The three-bay facade has a central entrance with sidelights and is covered by a portico with flat roof. There is also a bay window on the facade, we well as one on the suthern side, both with slate hipped roofs.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community)

There has been a house on this site since the early 19th century. Throughout that century the property was listed as belonging to the French family but available directories don't show any member of this family ever living on Prospect St. The house shown on the 1895 atlas seems to have the proper outline.
