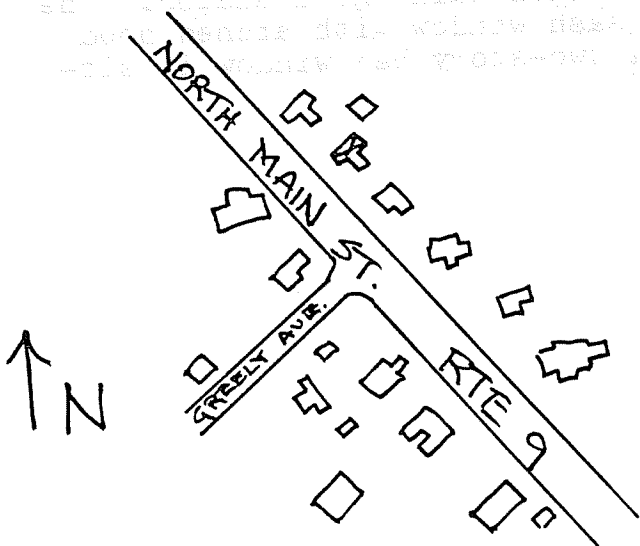

9. Historical significance (include explanation of themes checked above)

In 1872 Levi Campbell, from Plainfield, Mass., bought lot no. 4 of Charles Warren's subdivision plan for the north side of North Main St. for \$400. Levi was one of three Campbell brothers from Plainfield who bought lots adjacent to each other here on No. Main St. His house first appears on the 1884 atlas.

The house is two-and-a-half stories tall and L-shaped. The front gable has a small two over two sash window with arched hood mould and decorative label steps. A two-story bay window is situated on the front of the side ell.
