9. Historical significance (include explanation of themes checked above)

This house was built at a cost of \$6000 in 1909 for L. Raymond Marin, a local physician. It features a three story corner tower with flaring polygonal roof and finial and a one-story porch that extends across the facade and along the Trumbull Rd. side to the two-and-a-half story gabled projection. The porch has a hipped roof with fluted piers and a balustrade of closely spaced square balusters. A similar, smaller porch is on the second floor at the northern end of the facade.

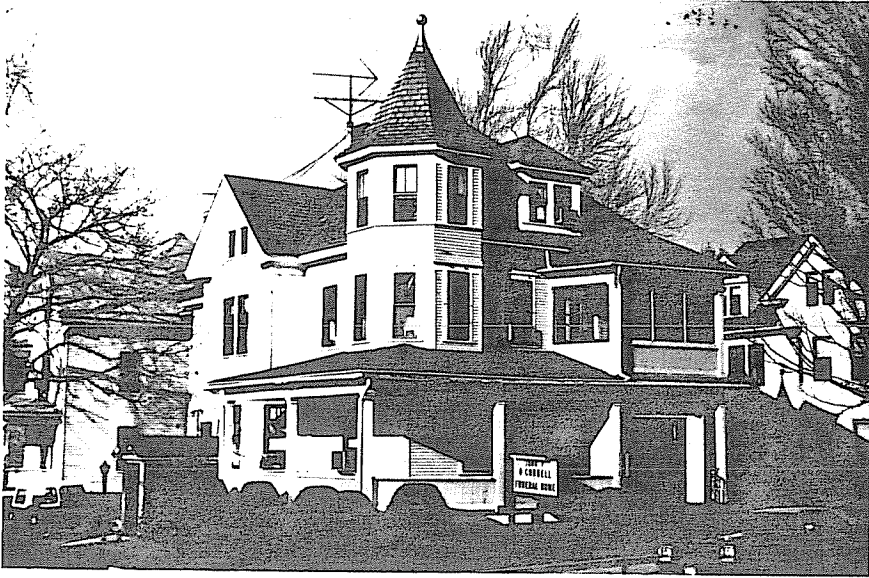

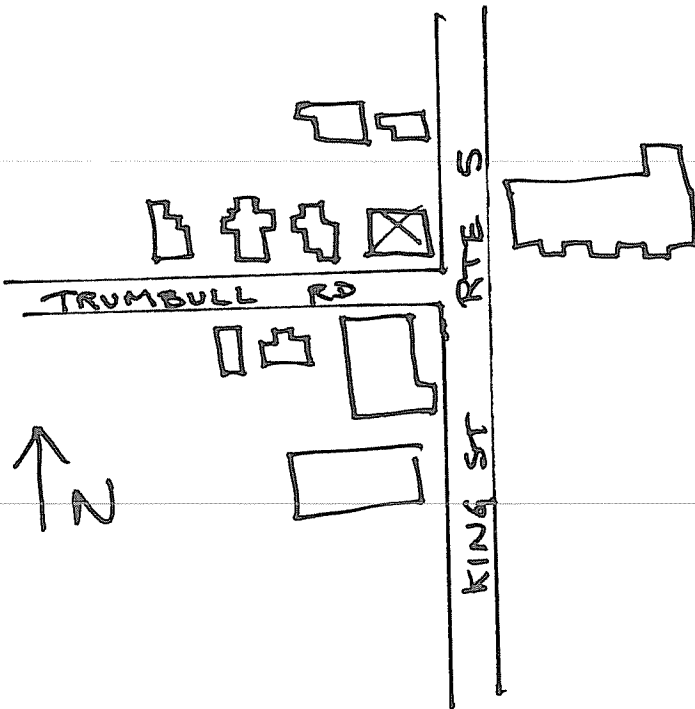
