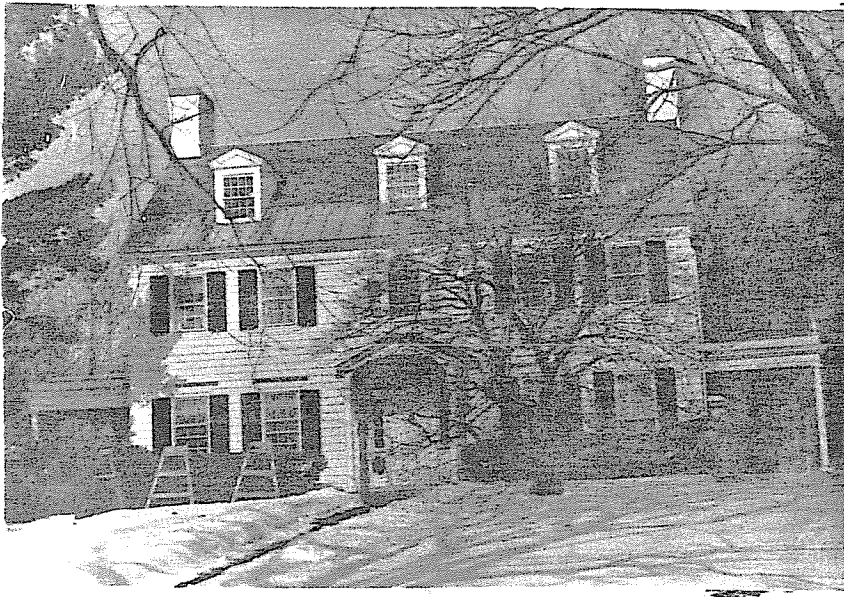

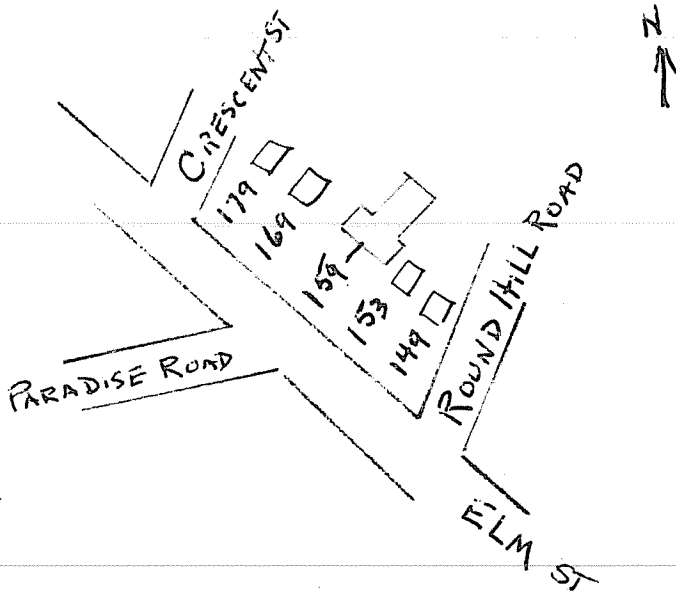

 An ell in the rear was designed for servants quarters. This was
 subsequently made into a garage and a separate apartment.
 Miss Maltby belonged to an old Northampton- Elm street family.
 The house was inherited after her death by Mrs. Edith F. Marshall,
 nee Maltby. Purchsed from Mrs Marshall by William Cochran. Shaub
 purchased from Cochran. in 1941.
