



ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE (describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within community)

The house is locally known as "The Gables" and is a Gothic Revival house executed in the "Tudor manner". Humble brick wall are concealed with white paint, giving the appearance of a richer building material. Ten gables in two sizes break into the lines of the roof. Rectangular windows with elaborate architraves and Tudoe "dripstones" appear on the first story, while windows with pointed arches nestle beneath the gables and above the entranceway. The central entrance is enhanced by a portico with low Roman arches.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community)

This house was built in 1860 for William Hale. At that time Mr. Hale was cashier of the Hoyoke Bank, this was later reorganized as the First National Bank of Northampton and Mr. Hale rose to the presidency. In 1880 A.L. Williston bought the property and had the house moved south to its present location so that he could have a new residence constructed. The Hale house was occupied by Robert Williston, A.L.'s son.
