

extensive wooden Ionic columned porch with balcony is situated on the east side of the house; a smaller balcony is placed to the rear. A rectangular brick entityway projects from the center of the facade.

Relatively austere in ornamentation, the symmetrically arranged facade is composed of paired sash windows, with plain classical white wooden moldings and cornices above. The light yellow clapboarding reflects the turn of the century Colonial revival.
