This is the northernmost of the three brick houses on State St., all of which exhibit the decorative work of the late 19th century mason. In 1882 Peter Foley, a gardener, bought lot no. 3 of the Talbot estate subdivision for \$500. By 1884 this house was erected.

The house is two-and-a-half stories in height with gable en to the street and a two-and-a-half story gabled projection on the noethern side. The house features black brick banding and bricks laid diagonally to create string courses connecting the lintels and to outline the lintels themselves. A one-story front porch extends across the facade and is composed of a hipped roof, turned posts, fancy brackets and a balustrade with spindles and cut-out patterns.
