The 1873 atlas shows a house on this site, owned by George Harris, a printer in the Gazette office. Mr. Harris continued to be listed at this address into the early 20th century, but it doesn't seem as if the present house is the original one. By 1885 Mr. Harris had become a co-owner of the Gazette Printing Co. with George S. Gere. This company did job printing, and had been split off from the newspaper publishing company, the Hampshire Gazette. Most likely Mr. Harris had a new house built for himself at some point in the late 1880's or early 1890's. The 1895 atlas clearly shows this house, but the outline appears different on the 1884 atlas.

The house is two-and-a-half stories in height with gable end to the street and a two-and-a-half story galbed projection on the southern side. Above the second floor lintels the house is clad with decorative shingles. A one-story hipped roof porch extends across the facade and on the southern side to the projection. The porch has turned posts and a balustrade of turned spindles. A one-story bay window projects from the southern side.
