ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE (describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within community)

The house is two-and-a-half stories tall with ridge roof and large gabled dormer on the front. The second story of the house is clad with wood shingles, laid in a decorative manner, while the first story is covered with clapboards. A one-story porch with shed roof, gabled entrance, arched openings with turned posts and balustrade covers the main entrance on the facde and is surmounted by a small hipped roof porch with turned posts and balustrade. There's also a porch on the eastern side of the house, similar to the main porch on the facade.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community)

Paradise Rd. was laid out during the late 1860's for residential development but only had five houses constructed thereon by 1884. During the late 1880's though, the entire "Paradise" area underwent development. Over the next 25 years most of the present day houses were built.

In 1886-87 this house was built for J.H. Pillsbury, a profeor of Biolog at Smith College, at a cost of avout \$4000. Prof, Pillsbury soon left the area and the house bacame property of Smith College. For most of the 20th century, this has been known as "Sunnyside", and has served as the nurses home, with the infirmary located just across the street.
