

9. Historical significance (include explanation of themes checked above)  Charles A. Maynard purchased in 1979 the properties of the Clement and Hawkes manufacturing Co. at the foot of what was then called Mill Lane for the manufacture of hoes and other garden equipment. He built soon after this cottage on the northwest side of what is now College Lane. It was occupied by Daniel Riley, machinist, Maynard's employee. In 1917 Maynard sold the whole factory property to Smith College. The house was then occupied by Franklin King, the superintendent of building and grounds at Smith. In about 1940 the building was reassigned to the newly founded College Faculty Club. It was occupied by Miss Randall, the Dean of the College, for a decade from 1950 - 1660. In 1960 the College built the present Faculty Center which was attached to the cottage structure, when it returned to its earlier function as a part of the Faculty Club building.
