The J. Van Slyke House located on North Maple Street is a superb example of a Second Empire suburban edifice. Dressed in a salmon color, the house has a dinstinctly autochthonous or earthy character. The dental work is concise and thoroughly aesthetically pleasing. From an architectural perspective, it is important as it conforms to a symmetrical and rigidly planned medium. The emphasis on the complicated three-dimensional modelling, especially that of the mansard roof prepared the way for the subsequent Shingle Style in America.

Today General William P. Hurley resides here. He has

occupied the dwelling for a number of years.
