9. Historical Significance (include explanation of themes checked above)

Located on West Street just below the Forbes Library, this structure appears to date from the early nineteenth century and exhibits characteristics of both the Federal and Greek Revival styles of architecture. A symmetrical facade with paired chimneys and roof ridge parallel to the street is predominantly Federal, while pilasters and enclosed gable are Greek Revival features. An addition and two story portico are later features.
