

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community)

The present reading room of the church at 79 Masonic St. was moved from the corner site upon which the church was built in 1908. It adjoins the church the facade of which, with its Doric columned portico, raised, is flanked by hipped projections. The entrance way has two narrow windows flanking the doorway which is crowned by a eight lighted transom. The symmetrical arrangement is carried out with nine windows on each side of the building while hipped dormers also project from each side of the roof.

Inside these dormer windows become lunette shaped, contained in an arch vault of the barrel vaulted ceiling. Side aisles have flat ceilings which join the corniced beams of the barrel vault base which is supported by two Doric columns.

The stark interior is all in white with only the pew arms and backtops done in dark wood for contrast and relief. A raised platform contains the preachers podium and chairs.
