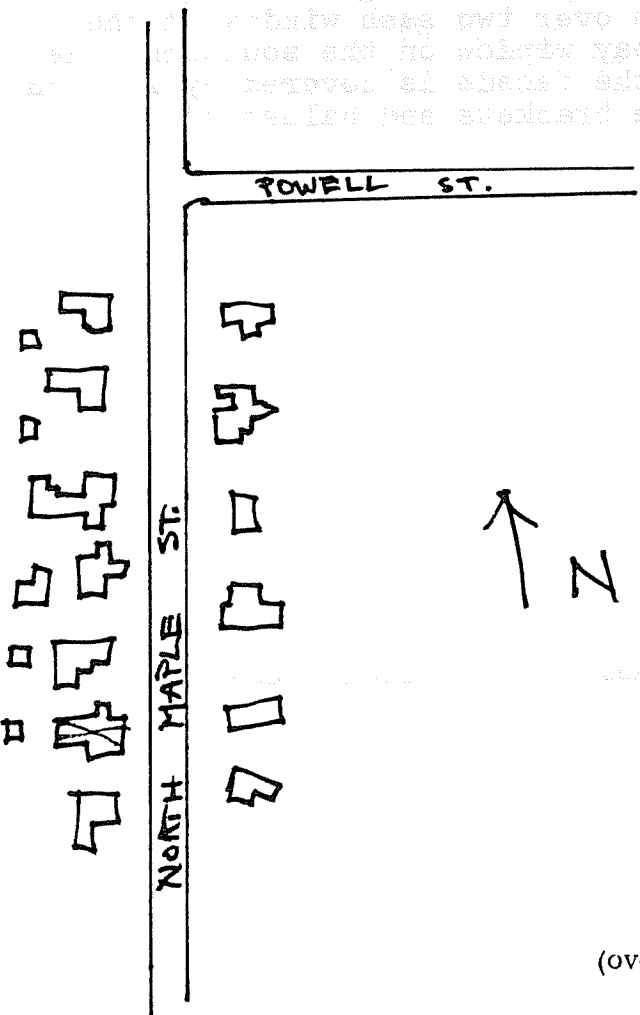

9. Historical significance (include explanation of themes checked above)

This house first appears on the 1873 atlas as property of a R. Martin. It was built sometime after 1867 when G.F. Miller filed his subdivision plan for the northern half of North Maple St.

The house is two-and-a-half stories in height with gable end to the street and a "Gothic", two over two sash window in the front gable. There is a one-story bay window on the southern side of the house and the first floor of the facade is covered by a porch with flat roof, posts with decorative brackets and balustrade.
