In 1871, Memorial Hall was built on the hill above the Gas Light Company buildings. Public subscription and town funds contributed equally to its construction. Books from other local libraries were consolidated at the new Clarke Library and reading rooms on the Main floor. A bequest of \$40,000 by John Clarke maintained the library. In memory of the soldiers who served the town since 1654, a list of all of the city's military men is displayed in the foyer. The second floor of Memorial Hall now houses a collection of early Northampton artifacts, maintained by the Northampton Historical Society. The plan of Memorial Hall was executed by James McLaughlin of Cincinnatti. McLaughlin apparently never came to Northampton; W. F. Pratt was charged with overseeing the actual construction of the building. Memorial Hall is the only example of the Post Civil War "General Grant" style of architecture on Main Street. Rich red brick, white stone trim, and black mansarded roof are combined to create ornamental effects which contrast with the picturesque City Hall, the solid republicanism of the Greek Revival church and the delicacy of the classical
