

This large house was probably built by Charles Whiting shortly after he acquired this lot from the estate of Jonathan Wells in 1899. Mr. Whiting was a partner with J.L. Mather in a carpentry and masonry firm. The house is two stories tall with hipped roof and hipped dormers. The first floor is built of brick with black glazed headers, while the second floor is clad with wood shingles.
