Walnut St. was opened in 1854 by Josiah Whitney, but the southern side of the street wasn't developed until much later. By 1884 there were only four houses on this side. Most of the houses were constructed within the next decade including this L-shaped cottage. The first known owner and occupant of this house was Andrew Hyde, a manufacturer of violins and 'musical merchandise', who was listed here in the 1895-96 directory.				
The house is 1½ stories in height and L-shaped, with gabled ends. The entrance is located in the crook of the L and covered by an extension of the gabled roof. This porch had turned posts and a pattern balustrade and is crowned by a triangular dormer with pointed window.
