In 1885 David Hall, a physician at the Northampton State Hospital, bought lot no. 2 on Graves' plan. This corner lot was soon developed with this four tenement row. The block is two stories in height with ridge roof and gabled dormers. The symmetrical facade has two pavilions, two stories in height, which each contain a double entrance, and have a one-story porch with hipped roof, turned posts with brackets and patterned balustrade. There are also four bay windows on the facade. Vertical board friezes are used under the eaves and between the first and second stories of the house.
