	The bank, 1928, by J. Williams Beal and Sons, is in the style which has recently become fashionable again, the so-called Art Moderne or Art Deco (a name derived from the 1925 Paris Exposition of "Arts Decoratifs"). This style was akin to the art nouveau in that the designers believed that every element of the building should correspond to bronze doors and the magnificent bronze and marble work and stained glass of the interior follows the same pattern of stylized natural forms. Typical of the Art Deco approach to design is the geometric character of the ornament and the fact that the carving does not project from the surface but rather is cut back into the stone so that one has a self-contained, rather cubic outer mass. Northampton is fortunate in having so splendid an example of this style; in such predominantly Victorian towns one seldom finds such a completely conceived Art Deco building.					
	The Pioneer National Bank faces the Hampshire County Courthouse across King Street. The junction of King, Pleasant, and Main Streets has long served as a focal point of public activity. The Pioneer Bank was the site of the first post office in 1792. In 1818, the oldest continuous county fair in the United States took
