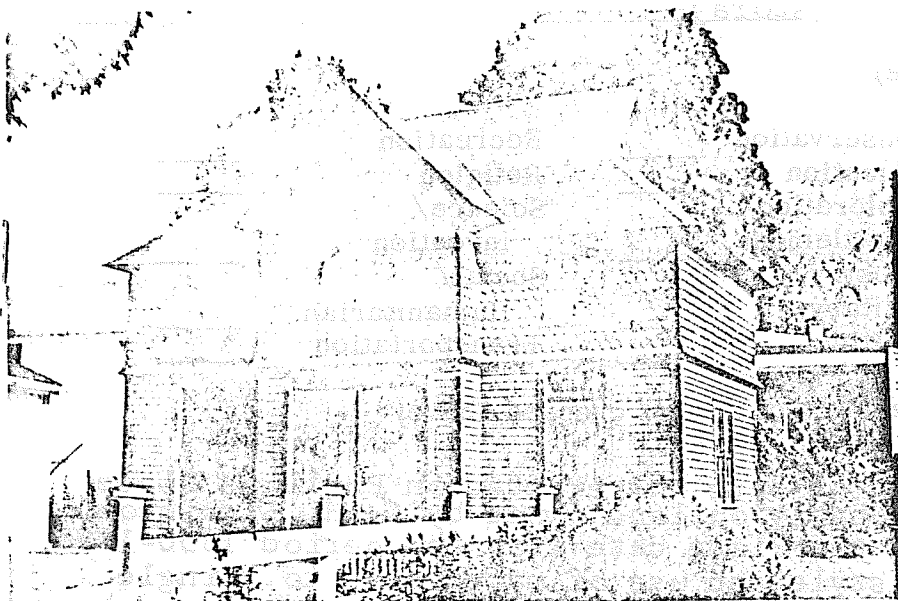

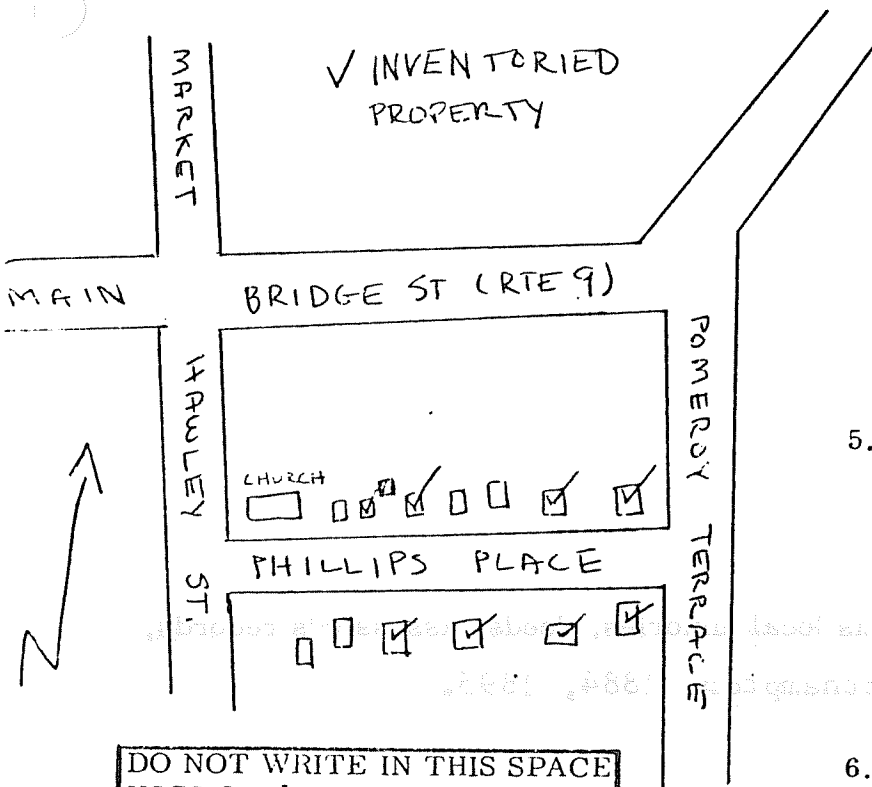

9. Historical Significance (include explanation of themes checked above)

This well built shingled barn was erected on Phillips Place between 1884 and 1895, probably on land owned by C. H. Dickinson. Although the dwellings on the Place date from the period 1850-1860, the barn relates, in its style and use of materials, to shingle style houses on Pomeroy Terrace and elsewhere in the city.

The structure features a projecting, gabled portion and perpendicular mass with ridge roof and shingled upper story.
