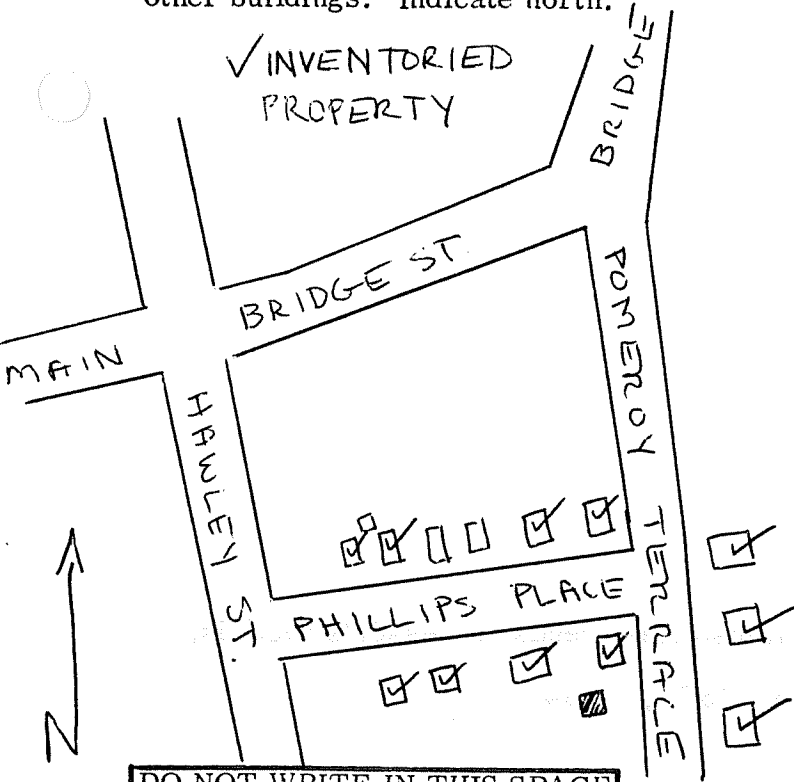

9. Historical Significance (include explanation of themes checked above)

This small house off Pomeroy Terrace first served as an outbuilding for 59 Phillips Place, a Greek Revival residence. The structure mimics the Italianate splendor of the Osmyrn Baker House on Pomeroy Terrace. Each is a cubic mass with projecting flat roof and belvedere with round headed windows. A porch has been added to the structure.
