

9. Historical significance (include explanation of themes checked above)

This Richardsonian Shingle style residence is in original condition. The exterior wall surface is covered with large dark shingles; the shingle skin secures the curving forms of the south and east bays and the massive north tower to the body of the structure. Wooden stringcourses are also used to maintain fluid movement of the eye across the surfaces of the facade. Carvings appear on the north facade; leaded design windows appear above large windows in the north, east, and sout facades.

The house was probably built between 1884 and 1895. Lewis Warner purchased the lot of land in 1874, at which time a smaller house was on the property. Given the retarditaire nature of Northampton architecture, the house could hardly have been built before 1890. It is unquestionably indicated on the 1895 Easthampton-Northampton Atlas.
