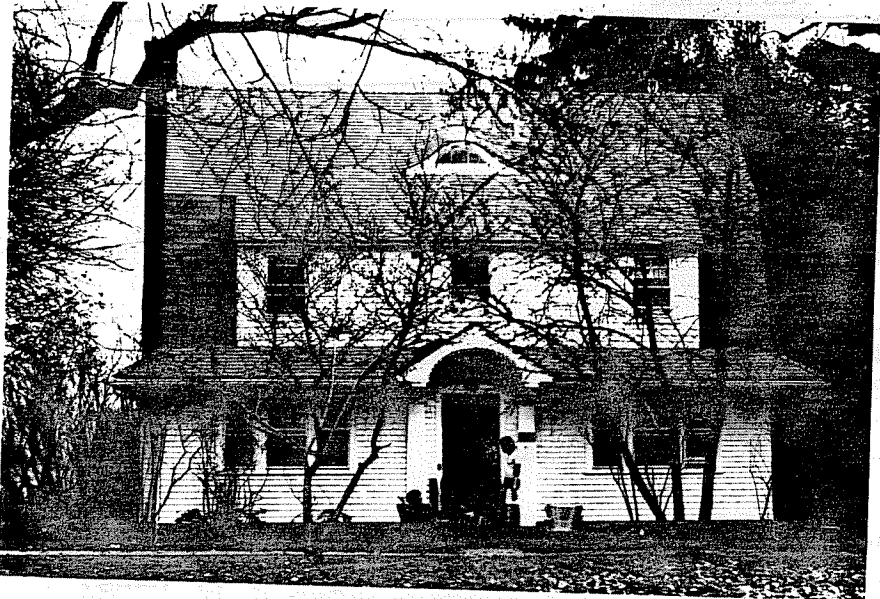

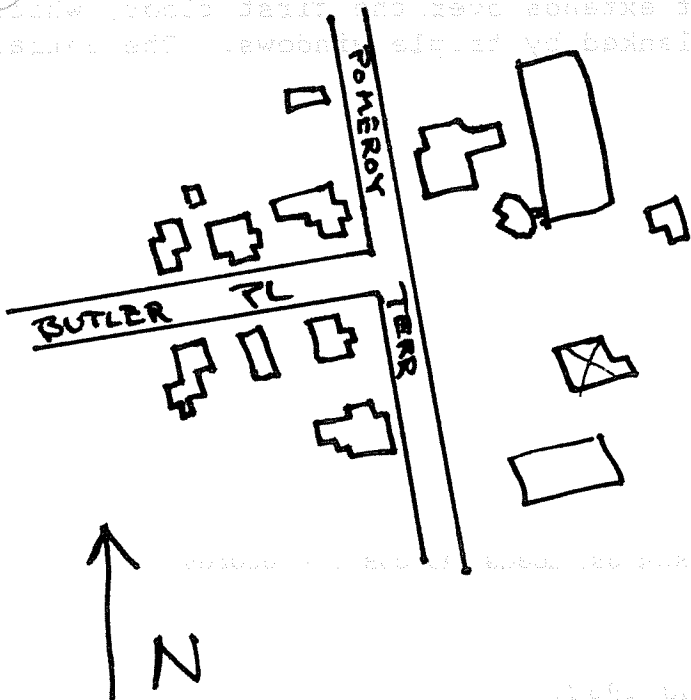

9. Historical significance (include explanation of themes checked above)

This relatively small, well set-back house was built sometime before 1915 on a part of the Henry Dickinson estate, Raymond B. King, a shipping clerk for Mc Callum Hosiery Co., is listed here in the 1915 directory.

A high, gambrel roof caps the one-story, shingled base. A long shed dormer extends from the break in the roof, and is surmounted by a swept window, while a pent roof extends over the first floor, which is composed of a central entrance flanked by triple windows. The entrance has a segmented portico.
