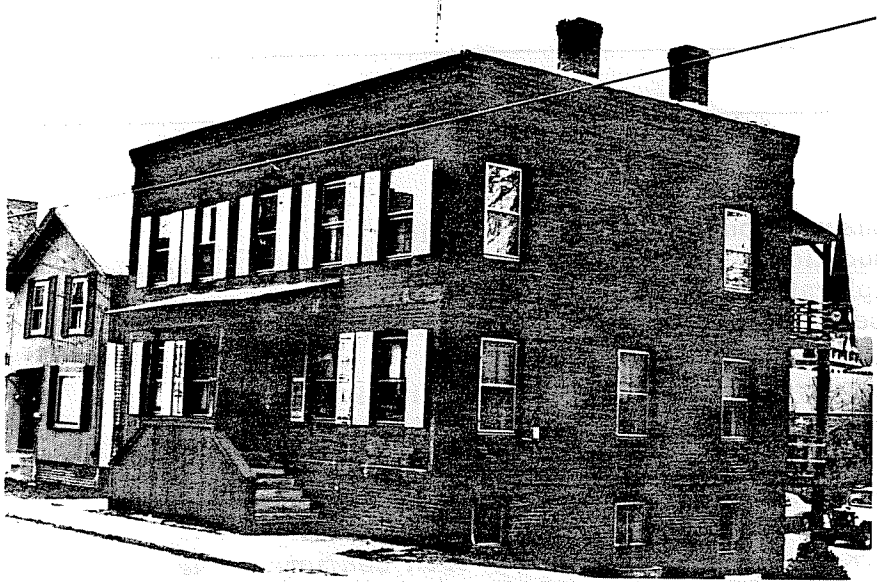

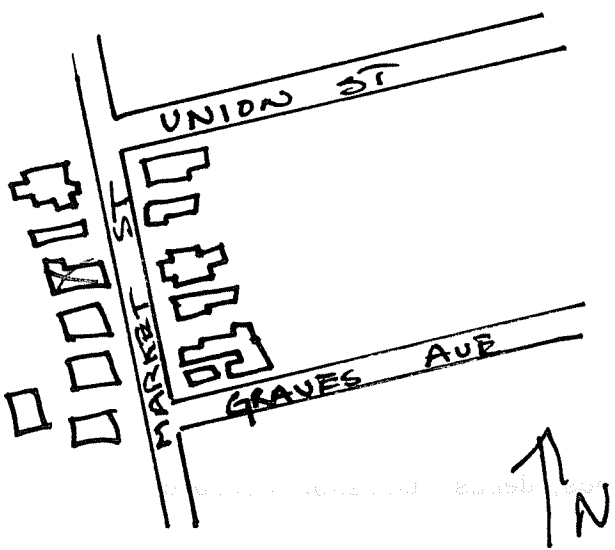

9. Historical significance (include explanation of themes checked above)

This small, brick tenement block was built late in the 19th century. The 1884 atlas shows a wood frame structure on the site, while the 1895 atlas shows a brick block. Both atlases have Charles Clark, a Main St. lawyer as the owner of the property.

The block is located on a sloping site, and is two stories high in front and three stories in the rear. The block contains six flats, and has a brick cornice, dentil row and frieze. The two over two sash windows have slightly projecting arch lintels of brick butt ends and lugsills, also of brick butt ends. The five-bay facade has a central entrance which is covered by a one-story wooden porch with shed roof and an entrance on either side.
