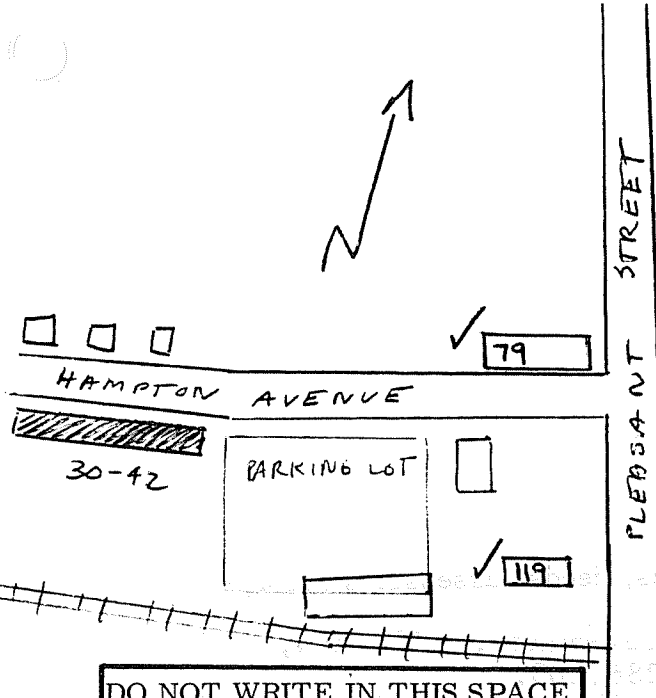

9. Historical significance (include explanation of themes checked above)

This wooden frame building is one of several units of worker's housing built near the center of Northampton in the later nineteenth century. (E. N. Foote Company owned a similar block (brick) of housing on Lyman Road.) Three stories in height and economical in its design, this block was located in a less than fashionable area abutting the railroad tracks and coal yard.

The block of worker's housing will probably be removed at some stage of an urban redevelopment project now in the planning process.
