

In 1828 Samuel Clark bought a third of an acre from Justice Parsons for \$200. The house seems to appear on the 1831 town map. During the 1840's and early 1850's the house was owned by Nathan and Henry Dikeman. Afterwards the property passed to the hands of Henry S. Gere, proprietor of the <u>Hampshire Gazette</u>. Mr. Gere lived here until the late 198's when he has a large house built on High St. (now Lyman Rd.) for himself. His Conz St. house passed to his son Collins H. Gere.

The house is two-and-a-half stories in height with pedimented gable to the street. The tympanum is clad with flush borrding and had a round-headed window form. The three-bay facade has an offset entrance with pilasters, sidelight and entablature.
