	This 2 story, 84'x 32' brick block was built in 1854 for Webster
	Herrick. The block is set back from Pleasant a, with an eleven bay facade, which
	is divided into thirds by two doorways, each with four-light transoms. The same
	fenestration and doorways mark the eastern face, which is oriented towards the
	railroad tracks. The end walls are four bays wide and feature brick corbelling and a
	partial return of the gable. State is used for the gable roof, while granite forms the window sills and a water table.
	Hubston Hammide come to Northampton in 1927 at the come of 14 to Jacob
	Webster Herrick came to Morthampton in 1827 at the age of 16, to learn
	the wagon maker's trade. During the 1830's he travelled, first to California, then
	to South America, setting up rice-hulling machines. In 1840 he returned to Northampton
	and engaged in the machine business, in which he remained until his death in 1892.
	A circular saw mill was set up at the millyard off King St. in 1845. Herrick patented
	the mill and this became the mainstay of his business. For the Civil War effort he
	made rifling machines which were used to manufacture rifle barrels at Bay State. An
	indication of the extent of Herricks business can be obtained frim his business notice in the 1873 Ailas:
