

These brick factory structures date from the period of industrial prominence of Northampton and surrounding towns. Several similar groupings of industrial buildings are located in the area bounded by Pearl, Pleasant, and Holyoke Streets and the B & M Railroad bed. The structures are characteristically simple rectilinear forms, several stories high but predominantly horizontal in emphasis. Chimneys are large and prominent. A series of industrial concerns located on the site in the nineteenth century, including the W. H. Clapp Iron Foundry,

and the Harlow Planing Mill.
