

9. Historical significance (include explanation of themes checked above)

This small Greek Revival residence was probably built in the early 1850's for Willard Lyon. He had obtained two acres from Anne Clarke in 1853. Clarke's homestead was located on the east side of lower Pleasant St. and was crossed by the CRR Co's tracks. The two acres were east of the tracks. In 1855 Lyon sold a much smaller piece of land (the current premises) with a dwelling house thereon to Henry M. Shepherd. Shepherd was a tenant in the house at the time of the sale.

This 1 1/2 story, side-hall "cottage", with a 1 story rear ell remains substantially the same today as when it was erected
