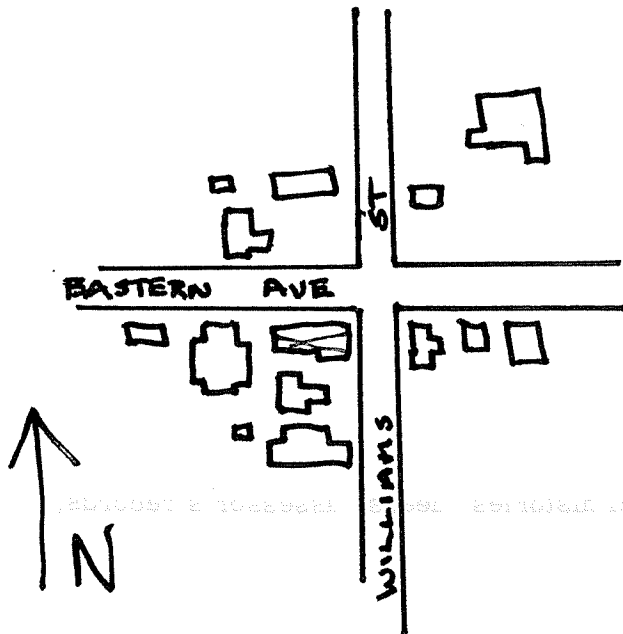

This Queen Anne styled rowhouse is one of two on the southern side of Eastern Ave. A three-story corner tower with flaring, polygonal roof and finial defines the corner of Eastern Ave. and Williams St. The Williams St. side also has a two-story, three-sided bay capped by a projecting wall dormer. On the facade there are two two-story porches (remodeled) each capped by projecting wall dormers.
