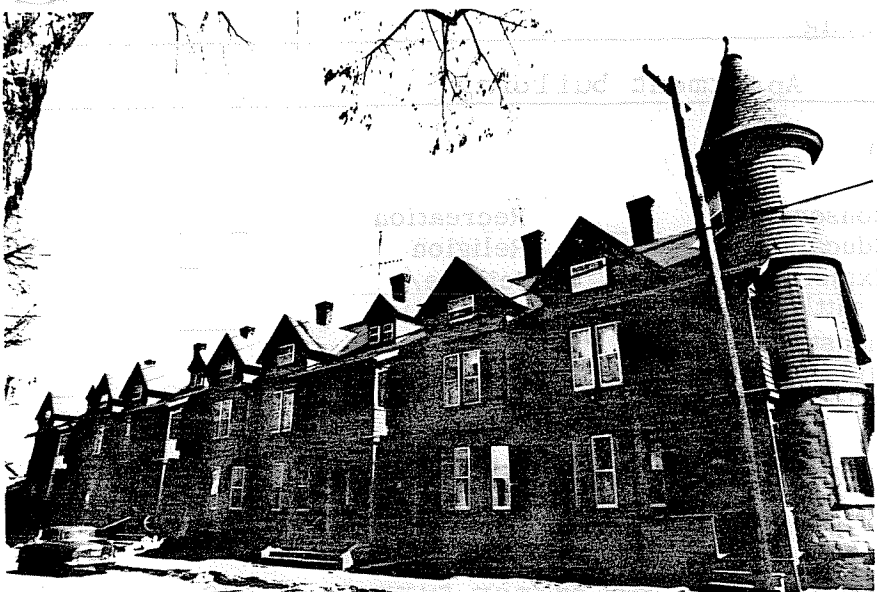

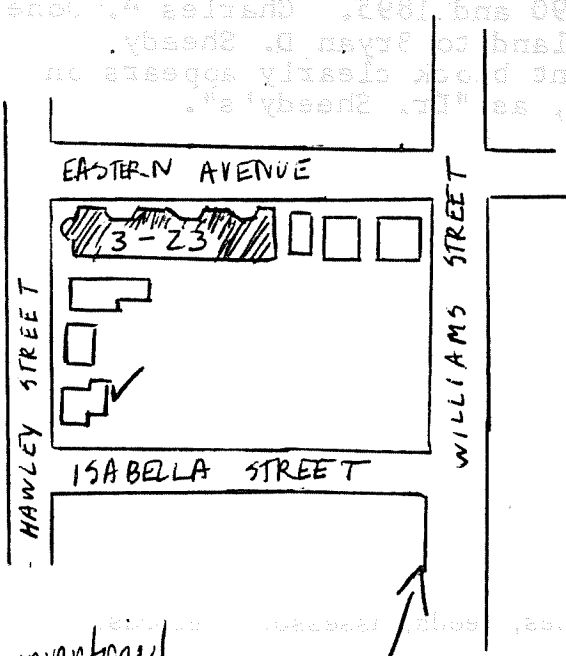

9. Historical significance (include explanation of themes checked above)

This turn of the century apartment building on Eastern Avenue is remarkable in its styling. The corner turret, three stories in height, is shingled like the upper story of the body of the house, and is quite independent of the main structure. Porches have decorative beading between the supports and the numerous gables contain stick style brackets.

The tenement was built between 1890 and 1895. Charles N. Jones and B. E. Cook transferred the lot of land to Bryan D. Sheedy in June, 1890, for \$1,600; the apartment block clearly appears on the 1895 Northampton-Easthampton Atlas, as "Dr. Sheedy's".
