

This late Federal style house was built for Levi Strong, a cooper and farmer. Mr. Strong was of the fourth generation of Strongs to occupy the family homestead on Hawley St. This land had been held in the family since the late 17th century.

The house is two stories high, built of brick, and has a low, It is five bays wide, and two bays deep, with a central entrance and a small entry porch. A thin Classical cornice caps the bl Several additions have been made to the rear, probably at the time of the Belding Brothers and Co.ownership, when the building was probably used as housing for their silk mill workers.
