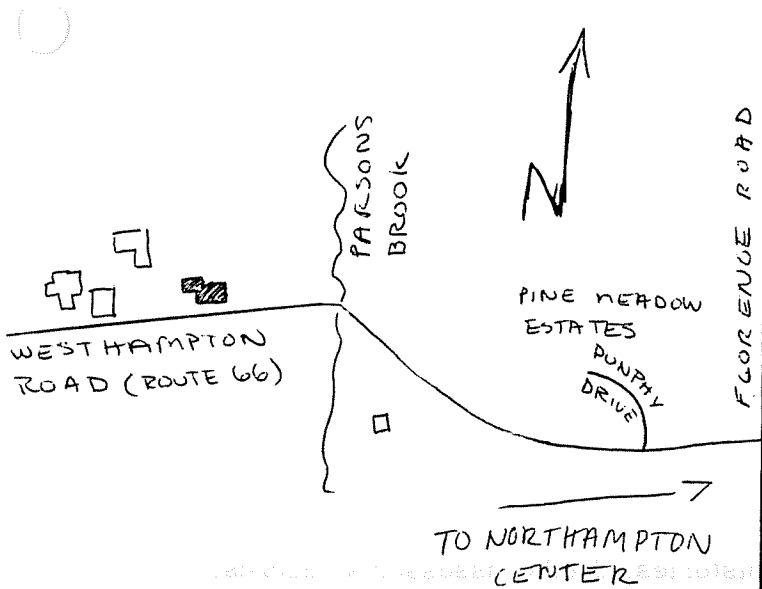

9. Historical significance (include explanation of themes checked above)

This simply styled residence is located on Westhampton Road about equidistant from Northampton center and the village of Westhampton. The clapboarded structure is five bays wide, two deep, and is topped by a ridge roof. Two chimneys, one original and a second apparently replacing the second of the original pair, are present. The entranceway is set with recessed sidelights and transom. A later portico and addition to the westerly facade are also present.
