In 1867 the Williamsburg to Northampton Railroad was opened. The tracks ran parallel to, and just north of, Main and North Main Sts. in Florence and a depot was established on North Maple St. The railroad spurred industrial and residential development north of Main St. in Florence. During this period Fruit St. (now Keyes St.) was laid out. This is one of the earliest houses on the street, first apearing on the 1873 atlas.

The house is one-and-a-half stories in height with gable end to the street. Decorative barge boards adorn the ends of the front gable and there is a one-story, hipped roof porch with turned posts and ornate brackets extending across the three-bay facade. ern side of the house has a one-story bay window. A two-story barn is attached to the house through two rear ells. Today this serves as a florist shop, with the greenhouse located behind it. The greenhouse was established in the early 20th century by F.D. Keyes, who lived in the house next north to this one.
