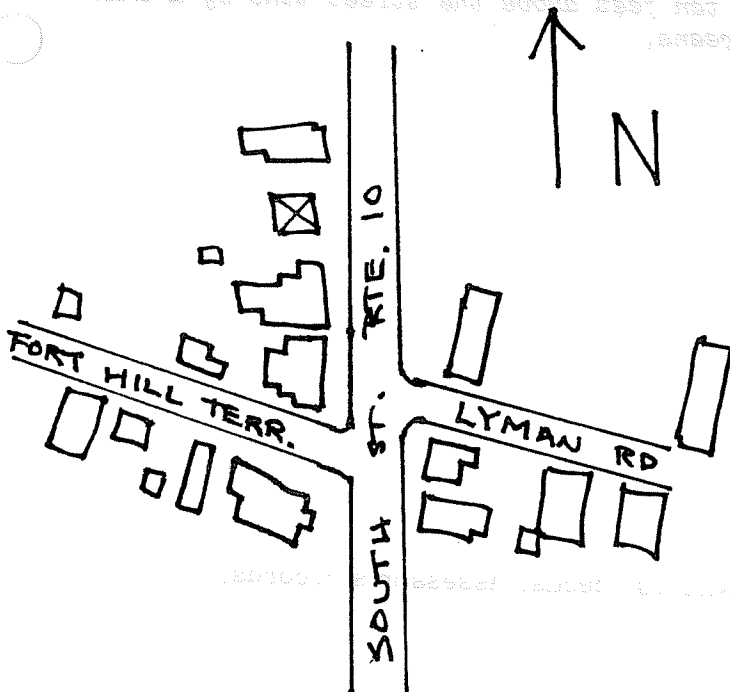

*This house was built during 1916 for George Harlow at a cost of \$6000. Harlow had a store on Center St. in Northampton, which sold furniture, carpets and stores.*

*This one-and-a-half story bungalow features a recessed porch with massive tapered piers which extends the full length of the facade, a long shed dormer with three windows, and one-story bay windows with flat roof and projecting rafters on the northern and southern sides. The house is raised about ten feet above the street line by a small hill and is almost completely screened by evergreens.*
