Eleazer Strong Homestead c. 1797

133 South Street Northampton, Mass.

The Eleazar Strong Homestead was built at the turn of thel&8th century. The gently sloping hipped roof with two interior chimneys and evenly spaced windows in a shooth facade anticipate the Federal style in Northampton. The Strong Homestead has more window space in relation to the total area of the facade than the earlier Drury Homestead across South Street. A dentiled cornice appears beneath the roof. The house has two entrances with porticoes. Columns supporting the porticoes are echoed by pilasters applied on the &atadé. A transom marks the space above the side door; recessed sidelights flank the front door.
