9. Historical significance (include explanation of themes checked above)

An early brick tenement, the Foote Block was erected in 1893 on High Street, now Lyman Road. The early nineties was a period of growth in Northampton and the increase in population was reflected largely in the building of a number of tenements and multi-family houses, and in the construction of a few lavish residences. The construction of modest single family dwellings was either less common or of little news value at this time. Tenements like the Foote Block rented for \$12-15 and were in great demand, particularly when located close to the downtown area and the network of street railway lines.

The block is a three story brick structure with abundant gables, several dormers and later wooden porches. Decorative effects in brick include brick window arches, stringcourses defining the stories, and arches beneath each gable in the front facade.
